




### Unvaccinated Children - PDHS 2018.




## Immunization coverage gradually improved across the country



# Challenges to routine immunization during the COVID-19 era

- Parents unable or unwilling to access immunization services
- Staff unable to operate, leading to increased absenteeism
- Vaccine stockouts
- There was a 52.5% decline in the daily average total number of vaccinations administered during lockdown compared to baseline
- Enrolments declined furthest in rural districts, urban sub-districts

- ✓ Since 1996 till 2020, the immunization coverage has increased from 21% to 88%, beneficiaries included around 150,000 residents.
- ✓ HELP has no case of Poliomyelitis in last 20 years in our communities.
- HELP has two EPI centres and a network of CHWs who identify pregnant women and zero dose children.
- ✓ HELP-MCH centre registers every birth along with inoculating with BCG and OPV.
